Drypoint Monoprint: Unique Inking for Printmakers

Create uniquely colored prints with the addition of the rich, velvety line of the drypoint technique. Drypoint plates are created by scratching and scoring into a printmaking plate with sharp tools that are held like a pen or pencil. This two-plate process will combine the well-defined nature of line with the spontaneity of monotype for added color.

We will explore a variety of materials including Akua Inks, modifiers, drypoint scribes, roulettes, and papers. Participants will learn how to achieve a wide range of transparent to intense color effects, by printing with an etching press or the hand held Akua Pin Press. All levels welcome.
